As an example of the complex care that we currently deliver:

JG - 18 - Bristol, JG is an 18 year old male who has Severe Cerebral Palsy (spastic quadriplegia), JG is oxygen dependant, has a tracheostomy in situ and requires suctioning, JG is also epileptic and this requires management with a Vagus Nerve

Stimulator.



JG had been being cared for by NHS children's

services up until the age of transition, JG had formed a close bond with his care team and it was vital to JG and family that the transition of care was as smooth as possible with minimal disruption to routines as possible.

We identified a small specialist team to work with JG and after an initial period of introduction, shadow training and competency monitoring the NHS Children's team were able to withdraw their support and JG was successfully transitioned from NHS children's services to our complex care team, enabling JG to stay at home without disruption.
